## *ALBERT LANE/KENNETH TURVEY SCHOLARSHIPS*

### ***PURPOSE:***

- To reward and encourage achievement in vocal music with a stipend of \$500 to be paid to the institution of choice.
- To support and encourage young people who are striving for excellence by providing monetary support and recognition of effort.
- To provide an opportunity for the recipient to perform with the Huntsville Community Chorus.

### ***THE APPLICANT MUST:***

- Be a graduating high school senior for the *Turvey Scholarship* or post-high school vocal music student for the *Lane Scholarship*.
- Be a resident of Madison County *or* a member of a vocal performing group in Madison County.
- Demonstrate intentions of pursuing a serious course of vocal music study that meets the approval of the HCCA Scholarship Committee.
- Submit an application form accompanied by an essay of 100 words or less describing the applicant's musical interests and career goals.
- Submit two letters of recommendation to the HCCA Scholarship Committee, at least one of which must be from a music director or voice teacher.
- Audition before the HCCA Scholarship Audition Committee. Applicant will be notified of time and place upon receipt of all materials.

### ***AUDITION:***

- **The applicant will perform a total of three pieces: *two* pieces from the repertoire specified by the committee and *one* piece of the applicant's choice.** (See "Repertoire")
- **HCCA will provide the accompanist.**
- **The applicant will provide:**
  - **Original copy of music for accompanist.**
  - **Three judges' copies, with numbered measures, of all music to be performed. (Photocopies are acceptable.)**
- **The performance must be from memory.**
- **The applicant may have to return for additional hearings.**

### ***REPERTOIRE:*** (Choose from *two* of the following categories.)

- 17th or 18th century art song in original language.
- A romantic or contemporary art song in original language.
- Art song from classical or oratorio literature.  
*Please note that applicants for the Turvey Scholarship are discouraged from performing operatic arias.*
